

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Our worship life, especially during Holy Week, shapes us into Easter people—people who can imagine the buds of new flowers on a “dead” plumeria tree, people who can smell the verdant garden that will come with the rainy season, people who can sense hope, new life, and adventure where the secular world sees only an ending. We are the people who can catch the fragrance of Easter Resurrection even in the burial spices of Good Friday.

Resurrection is woven into the fabric of reality... but we can easily miss it. It’s too easy—and often very painful—to stop short of Resurrection and remain at the cross, or at the tomb, of our lives. What can we do to cultivate a “Resurrection correction” to our view of ourselves, one another, and our world?

One of the best ways to cultivate this healthy and hopeful view of reality is by participating in the great liturgies of our Christian life: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter. In these services—really one long service stretched over three days, called the Triduum or the Great Three Days—we touch the depths of Jesus’ story and of our own story. These services are like medicine for the sick soul... and who of us could not use a little more medicine?

As we pray for the Ukraine and wonder about our own safety, as we struggle with loss and illness, we know that without the corrective lenses of Resurrection the world can seem a dark and desperate place. Yet we experience in these services the great transition from darkness to light, from slavery to freedom, from anxiety and depression to joy; we experience Resurrection and can then place that pattern onto every happening in our lives.

So come and invest in your wellbeing by joining your St. Catherine’s family on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and The Great Vigil of Easter. Come and tune into the “Resurrection correction” that can make all the difference in our lives and in our service to the world. These services are gifts filled with grace; why not do something good for yourself and enter into this great Mystery?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,


In this early morning on the day in our Anglican Cycle of Prayer when we commemorate priest and poet John Donne we pray, "...grant that...we may see thy glory... and then, with all our skill and wit, offer thee our crown of prayer and praise...." To God we give our thanks and praise.



There is so much for which we are grateful this month - *has it really been only two months since our new rector has joined us?!* While there's always room for more, we are grateful for the blessing of our pews filling back up on Sundays, for lifting our voices in thanksgiving and praise, and for rubbing elbows with old friends and new. We're grateful for the return of the Wednesday Mid-Day Holy Eucharist and Service of Healing. For our fellowship, from a simple coffee hour following both services on Sunday, to the return of a full Sunday breakfast, and the renewed "Loyal Fellowship of Loaves and Fishes," we're grateful. The Lenten "Bowls and Bibles" program, led by our rector, has been a welcomed opportunity for even more fellowship, with wonderful soups and such, but also the chance to reflect on and discuss some of the lessons we will hear at the Great Vigil of Easter. It's been two years since we've last enjoyed a Lenten program.

We have a new roof, and thanks to the generosity of all who have contributed to our Endowment, we were able to contract for this capital improvement, avoiding debt, using only interest earned from the Endowment. *How cool was it to see our rector on the roof swinging the thurible and offering prayers, as the workers bowed their heads, hats in hand, grateful for the "Blessing of the Shingles?!"*

Last Sunday we heard from God's faithful servant, Catherine Temple, vestry liaison to Pastoral Care, in the first of what we hope to be many "Ministry Moments." She shared with us our new vision of four circles of pastoral care: prayers, visitations, meals and cards, and invited our prayerful participation. In addition to providing the continued opportunity for us to contribute to St. Vincent de Paul and Temple Terrace Elementary, our Service Commission invited vestry to participate in the HOPE Rally and Nehemiah Action, to learn more about important issues in our county around

criminal justice reform, mental health services and the environment, and to learn first-hand about the work of this organization and developing “beloved community,” a topic of great import addressed of the four candidates for Bishop Coadjutor in the Q&A sessions your Diocesan delegates, Rick Schultz, Jess Wiggins and the senior warden attended at the Cathedral Church of St. Peter with our rector.

Our Evangelism Commission has been meeting, and we now have new coffee mugs to offer our new members! Remembering we are all called to “The Great Commission,” Evangelism is looking for greeters. Vestry Communications liaison, Jeff Boe has been very busy as well. We are so grateful for his faithful service - from improving livestreaming, and the Wi-Fi connection throughout our campus, to working on strengthening our social media presence. PLEASE give prayerful consideration to how your gifts might serve our communications, and let Jeff know how you would be willing to serve. Of course we are ever-grateful to our Worship Commission and our Altar Guild in particular for their faithful service.

Vestry members are listed on the back of your weekly bulletin, along with the commissions and committees they serve. With the rector, vestry is beginning long-term “visioning.” The vestry board is back up in the parish hall. The agenda of our meetings and the approved minutes are published, and posted for your review. The rector and vestry welcome hearing your questions, concerns, and of course your positive feedback!

During this season of Lent, we have had the opportunity to prepare for our Lord’s Passion and Resurrection. We have had the chance as a parish to reflect both individually and together as the body of Christ. We have sought ways to serve both our parish community and the larger community and to lift up what lets our light shine. In this week following the Fourth Sunday in Lent, I confess my heart is leaping forward through Holy Week with longing to that “joyful Easter-tide,” but as our rector asked, let us continue to “create space” for God, emptying ourselves of all that separates us, so that, with joy, we might be filled with God’s grace.

Notes from the Junior Warden

St. Catherine's finally has a new roof! As you may have read last month or viewed from the display in the parish hall, we contracted with GreenTek Property Solutions last month to totally replace the roofing over our facilities. I am happy to report that the work has been completed and we have a roof that will hopefully last another 25 years before needing to be replaced again. The work was done in a professional and timely manner with a minimum of interruptions to our church life. Nothing was damaged during the process and the grounds are clean and free of any leftover debris. It was a long process involving many people over the last year to accomplish this. Many thanks to all who contributed during this major undertaking.



The next major project that needs to be addressed is the condition of our HVAC systems. For the last 18 months a search has been underway to find a company who can service and repair our systems on a continual basis. That search has proved difficult. At least 10 companies have been contacted and just before Christmas a company did come out who did the routine maintenance and repaired a number of units. They did a great job and we thought they would be the company we would use but unfortunately it did not work out as they stopped communicating with us. The search is still ongoing but the problem is our units are old and many companies would rather have us install new units rather than repair old ones. The estimates on this would be at least \$50K just to replace the units that cool the sanctuary. In addition, many of the fifteen units we have are in hard-to-reach locations and many companies don't want to deal with that. Also, due to the pandemic, many companies are short-handed and don't have the manpower to deal with so many units at one time. Hopefully by the next newsletter the issue will be resolved and we will stay cool as the weather gets hotter.

Finally, myself and several other members are attempting to reform the Building and Grounds Committee which has not met in several years during the pandemic but is sorely needed now as we are fully open for business and an increase in the usage of

our facilities as parish life picks up again. To be on the committee requires no special qualifications other than a willingness to serve and care for God's house that he has provided for us to worship and gather in. The committee meets once a month to plan and budget for ongoing and special projects and to coordinate work day events. 


Father James blesses the work on our roof that began the morning of March 14, 2022.

Notes from the Treasurer

The current financial position at St. Catherine's is stable. Total Revenue for the first three months is below what is budgeted but also are the expenses to date. As we look forward to the balance of 2022, we have learned that the potential revenue from Tai Chi coming back to St. Catherine's and giving their financial support to our parish is not going to happen in 2022. As the year progresses this will become more of an issue. The Vestry had budgeted six months' rental income from the Tai Chi group in the amount of \$15,600 for the year. Since this is not going to occur, the Vestry will need to rely on our parishioners to make up for this shortfall as the year progresses.



In addition, the total dollars committed through pledges from our parishioners to date for 2022 is also below our budgeted levels. St. Catherine's will depend on our parishioners' generosity and welcoming new members to offset these shortfalls as we move through the year. The addition of our new rector, Father James Reho and his wife Lori has given our parish great encouragement as we rejuvenate long standing ministries and begin new ministries and traditions at St. Catherine's. The excitement we all see in our parish gives us great reason to celebrate and anticipate all the great things for our future.

As we have stated in past *Wheel* Articles there are several different ways to make a contribution or submit your 2022 pledge:

- You may make your pledge or contribution on line through our website at www.stcathtt.org.
- You may mail your pledge or contribution to our church office.
- You may drop off your pledge or contribution to the church office during business hours, Monday through Thursday 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM.
- You may place your pledge or contribution in the collection plate at the church services on Sunday

The entire roof project has been completed utilizing funds we had accrued in the earnings from our endowment fund. Our contractor, GreenTek Property Solutions did a wonderful job in completing this entire project in a timely and seamless process for St. Catherine's. We would certainly recommend them for any parishioner anticipating roof replacement for your home in the future.




