

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

It is wonderful to be back with you all! As I write this, Lori and I have been back home from South Africa for four days, and I've already attended an all-day Stewardship Workshop with members of our parish, been with you on Sunday, and had a great first day back in the office. Life can get so busy that I find it's important to remind myself, from time to time, of the great guiding principles of our faith that make all our work worthwhile.

One of the great guiding principles of a mature Christian life is what is called *ubuntu* in South Africa. Ubuntu can be summed up in the saying, "I am because you are." Ubuntu—both an African philosophical concept and an Anglican theological concept—reminds us that we are who we are because of the people around us. It is other humans who make us human. We learn to laugh, cry, love, and even stand upright and use language from other people. We are *more than* individuals; we are inter-personal persons, with our identity coming largely as a gift from the communities in which we participate.

Ubuntu, then, is a way to understand the genius of Anglican poet John Donne when he writes, "Ask not for whom the bell tolls/ for it tolls for you." In the 25<sup>th</sup> chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus himself says that when we help (or ignore!) "the least of these" we do so to him: clearly he understood himself as connected to, and present in, every other person... just as we are! Theologically, ubuntu is grounded in the Scriptural understanding that we are all made in the image and likeness of God. And as Christians we understand that God to be Trinity, i.e., relational in nature.

Once we come to understand the interpersonal nature of our personhood, we come to understand that it is of great importance to support, comfort, and forgive one another. Certainly, in our hearts we know that there appears a hole, a tear, a rend to our own fabric, if we withhold forgiveness or compassion of needed help from another. Doing so more than a misguided way of seeming strong or to gain an upper hand; rather, it the way we unravel our own personhood. It is through relationships, mutual love and support, that we come to know the self-assurance and joyfulness promised to us in the gospels. Who is it you've not forgiven? Who is it you might be able to help? What relationship are you being called to deepen? What am I afraid to share with others—my story? my money? my time? The answers to all these questions here are invitations to strengthen your ubuntu, and to live even more fully into the image—and joyfulness—of Christ.

# STRATEGIC VISIONING

## Strategic Visioning Update: September



This month there is a lot of exciting progress to report as we allow the Holy Spirit to continue to guide us toward a governing vision for the future of our church family! On Saturday, August 13, nearly all our Vestry, together with nearly all our Strategic Visioning Team, gathered at DaySpring Episcopal Conference Center for a six-hour day of prayer, discussion, and inspiration all centered on our hopes and dreams as expressed during our work together on Pentecost. As the facilitator of this day, I can vouch for the energy, openness, and spirit of service that was present among all participants! From our youngest (16) to our oldest (80+), from those who joined St. Catherine's a few months ago, to those who have been members since before I was born (it's true!), all came together in a spirit of honoring the sacredness of *your* hopes and dreams for St. Catherine's.

The day began with prayer and reflection, and an exhortation to become hallow, the way a reed flute is hollow so that God's breath can make music by blowing through it. We then spent the first few hours together working on the "big questions," the table questions that were answered in small groups on Pentecost. As a refresher, these questions were:

# STRATEGIC VISIONING

What does an ideal St. Catherine's look like five years from now?

Our Mission Statement focusing on nurturing (cultivating our life as a parish) and sharing (engaging the wider world). What are the top opportunities we have in each of these areas?

What are some strengths that St. Catherine's should build upon?

What are some basic goals that St. Catherine's should focus on in the next 3-5 years, and why?

Let me emphasize that the work here was *not* for the Vestry and Visioning Team to give *their* answers to these questions, but to find the common threads and main themes that showed up in our small group work.

After a fun lunch break, I challenged our Vestry and Visioning Team to find the "three big ideas" in each of the areas you as individuals were encouraged to hang post-its on: Service, Worship, Evangelism, Education (Formation), Pastoral Care (our SWEEP Commissions), Buildings & Grounds, Parish Life, and Stewardship & Finance. They did an amazing job finding where *your* energy and wisdom were centered in each of these areas.


After this long day, we closed in prayer. It was very moving to me to see how deeply committed to, and touched by, this work each participant was. I came away from this day even more deeply honored to serve at St. Catherine's, and even more deeply encouraged about the brightness of our future!

Next steps: our Strategic Visioning Team will be working to craft practical possibilities from the work described above, eventually for presentation back to *you*, my sisters and brothers, so that our vision and our planning definitely reflects the best of the heart of our whole congregation!

## Notes from the Senior Warden

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



Stewardship works only if we are willing to commit to the belief that it is a vital and central part of everything that we are and that we do in our lives and in our church.


We are the living definition of "Stewardship". How we measure up to that definition is totally up to us with our loving God's ever present help.

## *Notes from the Treasurer*

Attached with this article is the St. Catherine's financial data through July 2022. We can see the detailed data for the month of along with the data "year to date" through July.

The information displayed here is a reflection of the parish performance to the operating budget for our parish. Not included here are the "Restricted" fund expenses and revenues. Such items as the recent roof replacement, weekly flowers and other designated expenses are not included in the operating budget.



For the month of July, pledge revenue was \$15,1130 over monthly budget with total revenue \$14,359 over budget. The reasons for this is that some parishioners chose to pay their annual pledge through a stock donation and those funds are funneled through our Endowment. In the month of July, we transferred those funds from the endowment to operating account which resulted in this positive outlook for the month of July. In addition the total expenses were also (\$440) under budget which gives a total positive performance to budget for July of \$13, 919.

Year to date info shows that pledge revenue is still (\$9,111) under budget with total revenue (\$16,731) under budget. Data also reveals total expenses for the year are also under budget (\$12,695). This leaves a net deficit to budget year to date of (\$4,036).

Although we are operating at a deficit to the budget through June, St. Catherine's had ample cash reserves at beginning of the year to tolerate the deficit. It is anticipated that deficit spending to the budget will continue for most of this current year. The parish is budgeted to move some funds from earnings in the endowment in 2022 to the operating account. The revenue from this future transferred funds will help with the deficit to budget as we move forward. We do not have sufficient pledge dollars committed for the year to meet our budget needs for the year, therefore requiring we move some funds from the endowment to our operating accounts to meet our budget needs for the year.

Our parishioners to date have been very faithful in remaining committed to their pledge dollars for the year. It is important for our parishioners to remain current with the pledge commitments for 2022.

We also recognize that personal circumstances can change, and wills and financial account beneficiary designations may need to be revised. Consequently, membership in the Oak Tree Society does not require any will or beneficiary designation to be written in stone. You can change your designation at any time. In short, the Oak Tree Society welcomes everyone, regardless of age or resources. Since we include our nursery children, the older children act as role models for the younger ones. When Children's Chapel is over, the nursery children return to the nursery, and the older children are escorted to church, to join their parents.

St. Catherine's, the diocese and Episcopal Church are concerned for the safety of our children. All volunteers must complete a background check and the diocesan course "Safeguarding Online."

The plan is to begin offering Children's Chapel during August, as this will give our volunteers time to do the child safety things and become familiar with the materials and songs, so that everyone can help with the singing. We are so excited to be able to have Children's Chapel — it has been a long 2+ years. Our children have not been limited in their ability to participate and be an active part of our faith community.
